What is K.RI.3?	K.RI.3 focuses on describing connections between individuals, events, ideas, or information in a text.
How can we describe connections?	Connections can be described by identifying relationships and patterns.
Why are connections important?	Understanding connections helps improve comprehension and critical thinking.
What are common misconceptions?	Common misconceptions include thinking connections are only between similar types of information and that they are always explicitly stated.
How can we correct misconceptions?	Correct misconceptions by using diverse examples and teaching inference skills.
