| What is K.RI.3? | K.RI.3 focuses on describing connections between individuals, events, ideas, or information in a text. |
| How can we describe connections? | Connections can be described by identifying relationships and patterns. |
| Why are connections important? | Understanding connections helps improve comprehension and critical thinking. |
| What are common misconceptions? | Common misconceptions include thinking connections are only between similar types of information and that they are always explicitly stated. |
| How can we correct misconceptions? | Correct misconceptions by using diverse examples and teaching inference skills. |
