| Why is understanding stories important? | Understanding stories helps build foundational literacy skills. |
| What are common misconceptions? | Common misconceptions include thinking all stories have morals and that illustrations are more important than text. |
| How can we address misconceptions? | Address misconceptions by using a variety of stories and discussing the role of text and illustrations. |
