What is listening comprehension?	Listening comprehension involves understanding what is heard.
Why is asking questions important?	Asking questions helps clarify and confirm understanding.
How can we clarify our understanding?	Clarification can be requested by asking specific questions about confusing parts.
Examples of when to ask questions	Examples include asking about story details, instructions, or information from a video.
