Common Stumbling Blocks

Some students might think prepositions are the same as conjunctions, but they are not. Others might think prepositions only tell us where something is, but they can also tell us when something happens or the direction something is going.

Prepositions are words that help us understand where things are, when things happen, or the direction something is moving. For example, 'during' tells us when something happens, 'beyond' tells us where something is, and 'toward' tells us the direction something is moving.
