Sentence Features Recognition

Today's Standard

1.RF.1a - Recognize the distinguishing features of a sentence (e.g., first word, capitalization, ending punctuation).

Real-World Applications for this Standard

Identifying the first word in a sentence during reading.; Noticing and using capitalization at the beginning of sentences.; Recognizing and using correct ending punctuation (periods, question marks, exclamation points).; Writing simple sentences with correct capitalization and punctuation.

Today I Learned

Today, we learned about the features of a sentence. We practiced finding the first word, using capital letters at the beginning, and putting the right punctuation at the end.

Common Stumbling Blocks

Some kids think any word at the start of a line is the first word of a sentence. Others believe all sentences end with a period. We need to help them understand that sentences can start anywhere in a line and can end with different punctuation marks.

Help Me

A sentence starts with a capital letter and ends with a punctuation mark like a period, question mark, or exclamation point. This helps us know where the sentence begins and ends when we read or write.
