Common Stumbling Blocks

Sometimes, kids think blending sounds is just saying them one after the other. They might also mix up sounds that are similar. We can help by showing how sounds come together and practicing with words that sound alike.

Help Me

Blending sounds helps us read words we don't know yet. We can use this skill when we see new words in books or on signs. For example, we can blend /d//o//g/ to read 'dog'.
