Today, we learned about identifying the narrator in a story. The narrator is the person or character who tells the story. Knowing who the narrator is helps us understand the story better.

Common Stumbling Blocks

Sometimes, kids might think the narrator is the main character, but that's not always true. The narrator can be someone else telling the story. Another mistake is thinking the narrator is always the author, but the narrator can be a made-up character.

Help Me
