Common Stumbling Blocks

Sometimes kids think they only need to ask questions, but they also need to answer them. Another problem is that they might focus on small details instead of the main ideas.

Help Me

When you listen to a story or watch a video, try to think about the most important parts. Ask questions about what happened and why it happened. This helps you understand the story better.
