

## Information Gathering Skills

### Today's Standard

1.W.8 - With guidance and support from adults, recall information from experiences or gather information from provided sources to answer a question.

### Real-World Applications for this Standard

Recalling details from a family trip to write a short story.; Using a picture book to answer questions about the story.; Interviewing a classmate about their weekend and writing a summary.; Looking at a weather chart to describe the day's weather.; Listening to a story and then drawing a picture about it.

### Common Stumbling Blocks

Some kids think they need to remember everything perfectly, but they just need to remember the important parts. Others think they can only get information from books, but they can also learn from talking to people and looking around.
