Common Stumbling Blocks

Some kids think that all verbs can be changed to past tense by adding '-ed', but that's not true for irregular verbs. Another common mistake is mixing up the past and present tense forms of irregular verbs.

Irregular verbs are special because they don't follow the regular rule of adding '-ed' to make the past tense. For example, instead of 'sitted', we say 'sat'. You can use these words when telling stories about things that happened before.
