Spelling Patterns in Writing

Today's Standard

Today, we learned about spelling patterns. These are rules that help us spell words correctly, like changing 'cage' to 'badge' or 'boy' to 'boil'.

Common Stumbling Blocks

Sometimes, kids think all words that sound the same are spelled the same way. Another mistake is thinking spelling rules always work the same. But English has lots of exceptions!
