Today's Standard

2.NBT.A1a - 100 can be thought of as a bundle of ten tens — called a 'hundred.'

Real-World Applications for this Standard

Counting money (10 dimes = 1 dollar); Grouping objects (10 packs of 10 pencils); Measuring length (10 sets of 10 centimeters); Understanding place value in numbers; Counting large quantities (100 apples)

Today, we learned that 100 is made up of ten groups of ten. This helps us understand big numbers better.

Common Stumbling Blocks

Some kids might think 100 is just a big number without knowing it's made of ten tens. Others might mix up tens and hundreds, thinking ten ones make a hundred.
