Common Stumbling Blocks

Sometimes, kids might add numbers from left to right, which can be confusing. Another mistake is forgetting to carry over when the sum of digits is more than 9. Practicing with examples can help fix these mistakes.

When we add two-digit numbers, we need to think about the tens and ones. For example, if you are adding prices at a store, you can group the tens and ones separately and then add them together. This helps you get the right total.
