Today we learned about prefixes and suffixes. These are parts added to the beginning or end of words to change their meaning. For example, 'happy' can become 'unhappy' or 'happiness'.

Common Stumbling Blocks

Sometimes kids think that adding a prefix or suffix always makes a completely new word, but it just changes the meaning a little. They might also mix up what different prefixes and suffixes mean.
