Today we learned about plural nouns. Plural nouns mean more than one of something, like 'cats' or 'boxes'. Some words change a lot when they become plural, like 'child' becomes 'children'!

Common Stumbling Blocks

Sometimes kids think all plurals just add 's'. But some words, like 'mouse', change to 'mice'. Also, they might mix up singular and plural forms, like saying 'childs' instead of 'children'.
