# **Extended and Short Writing Tasks**

## Today's Standard

3.W.10 - Write routinely over extended time frames (time for research, reflection, and revision) and shorter time frames (a single sitting or a day or two) for a range of discipline-specific tasks, purposes, and audiences.

#### Real-World Applications for this Standard

Writing a report on a favorite animal; Composing a letter to a pen pal; Creating a daily journal entry; Drafting a story over several days; Researching and writing a short essay on a historical figure
