Today I Learned

Today, we learned about antonyms and synonyms. Antonyms are words that mean the opposite, like 'hot' and 'cold'. Synonyms are words that mean almost the same thing, like 'happy' and 'joyful'.

Common Stumbling Blocks

Some kids think that antonyms are always exact opposites, but that's not true. For example, 'hot' and 'cold' are opposites, but so are 'warm' and 'cool'. Another mistake is thinking that synonyms are always the same in every sentence, but they can mean slightly different things depending on how they are used.
