Today, we learned about idioms and proverbs. Idioms are phrases that mean something different than the words say. Proverbs are short sayings that give advice or share wisdom.

Common Stumbling Blocks

Sometimes, kids think idioms mean exactly what the words say. For example, 'raining cats and dogs' doesn't mean animals are falling from the sky. Also, kids might mix up idioms with other figurative language like metaphors or similes.
