Sometimes, kids think any noun close by can be the pronoun's partner, but that's not right. Also, they might think it's always clear who or what the pronoun is talking about, which can be confusing. We worked on fixing these mistakes.

Help Me

A pronoun is a word that takes the place of a noun. If a pronoun is vague, it can make your writing confusing because the reader won't know who or what you're talking about. For example, if you say, 'It was fun,' we don't know what 'it' is. But if you say, 'The game was fun,' it's clear. Fixing vague pronouns helps make your writing clear and easy to understand.
