Extended and Short Writing Tasks

Today's Standard

6.W.10 - Write routinely over extended time frames (time for research, reflection, and revision) and shorter time frames (a single sitting or a day or two) for a range of discipline-specific tasks, purposes, and audiences.

Real-World Applications for this Standard

Writing a research paper over a week; Composing a reflective journal entry in one sitting; Drafting and revising an essay over several days; Writing a letter to a public official; Creating a blog post for a class project

Today I learned about writing for different lengths of time. Sometimes we write for a long time, like for a big project, and other times we write quickly, like for a short story or letter.

Common Stumbling Blocks

Some kids think they have to finish all writing in one go, which can be hard. Others think short writing isn't important, but it is! Writing short things well is just as important as writing long things.
