## Help Me

A theme is the main message or lesson in a story. For example, in many fairy tales, the theme might be that good always wins over evil. Knowing the theme helps us understand what the story is really about. When we summarize a story, we just tell the main points without saying what we think about it. This helps us focus on the important parts of the story.
