# Organizing Ideas in Writing

### Today's Standard

7.W.2a - Introduce a topic clearly, previewing what is to follow; organize ideas, concepts, and information, using strategies such as definition, classification, comparison/contrast, and cause/effect; include formatting (e.g., headings), graphics (e.g., charts, tables), and multimedia when useful to aiding comprehension.

Writing research papers with clear introductions and structured information.; Creating informative blog posts that use headings and multimedia for clarity.; Developing presentations that use charts and tables to explain concepts.
