Context Clues for Word Meaning

Today's Standard

Common Stumbling Blocks

Sometimes kids think context clues are only in the same sentence as the new word. They might also think the first meaning they guess is always right. It's important to check other sentences and use a dictionary.

Help Me

When you read and find a word you don't know, look at the other words around it. They can help you understand what the new word means. For example, if you read 'The sky was murky, or cloudy and dark,' the words 'cloudy and dark' help you understand 'murky'.
