Today's Standard

Counting toys and assigning each a number; Counting steps while walking; Counting fruits in a basket; Assigning numbers to seats in a classroom; Counting pages in a book

Common Stumbling Blocks

Sometimes, kids think the order of counting doesn't matter or that multiple objects can share the same number name. This can make counting wrong.
