



Counting Objects to 20

Today's Standard

K.CC.B5 - Count to answer 'how many?' questions about as many as 20 things arranged in a line, a rectangular array, or a circle, or as many as 10 things in a scattered configuration; given a number from 1-20, count out that many objects.

Real-World Applications for this Standard

Counting toys or blocks in a line or circle; Counting fruits or snacks during snack time; Counting steps while walking; Counting books on a shelf; Counting dots on dice during a game

Today, we learned how to count up to 20 objects in different arrangements like lines, circles, and scattered groups. We practiced counting carefully to make sure we didn't miss any objects.

Common Stumbling Blocks

Sometimes, kids think the number of objects changes if they move them around. Another problem is skipping numbers or counting the same object twice.
