Today, we learned about end punctuation marks. These are symbols like periods, question marks, and exclamation points that go at the end of sentences.

Common Stumbling Blocks

Sometimes, kids think that all sentences end with a period, but that's not true. Sentences can also end with question marks or exclamation points. Another tricky part is telling the difference between a question mark and an exclamation point.

Help Me

End punctuation marks are important because they tell us how to read a sentence. For example, a period means the sentence is finished, a question mark means someone is asking something, and an exclamation point shows strong feelings. Look for these marks when you read together!
