Common Stumbling Blocks

Sometimes kids think every letter in a word must be written as it sounds, which isn't always true. They also might try to pronounce letters that are silent. We practice to help them understand these tricky parts.

- Can you spell the word 'cat' by sounding it out?
- What sound does the letter 'b' make?
- How do you spell 'dog' using the sounds?

Help Me

Spelling words by sounding them out helps kids learn how letters and sounds go together. For example, when they write 'cat,' they use the sounds /k/, /a/, and /t/ to spell it. This skill is important for reading and writing in real life, like reading signs or writing notes.
