Common Stumbling Blocks

Kids might think that a word has only one meaning. But many words can mean different things. They might also try to understand words just by looking at pictures. It's important to use the whole sentence to figure out what a word means.

When you read a story, sometimes you find new words. You can understand these words by looking at the other words in the sentence. This helps you know what the new word means.
