Common Stumbling Blocks

Sometimes kids think they can read words in any direction, but we need to follow them from left to right. Another problem is thinking each page is separate, but we read from one page to the next.

Help Me

We read words from left to right and from top to bottom. This helps us understand the story better. When we read books, we start at the top of the page and move to the bottom. After we finish one page, we go to the next page.
