Real-World Applications for this Standard

Reading simple sentences in books; Writing names with spaces between first and last names; Creating labels for classroom objects; Reading signs and posters; Understanding spaces in typed text on a computer; Reading and writing captions for pictures

Today I Learned

Today, we learned that words in print have spaces between them. This helps us read and understand sentences better.

Common Stumbling Blocks

Some kids might think that words in print run together without spaces. Others might think that spaces can be put anywhere in a word. Both of these ideas can make reading and writing harder.
